FACE COORDINATORS

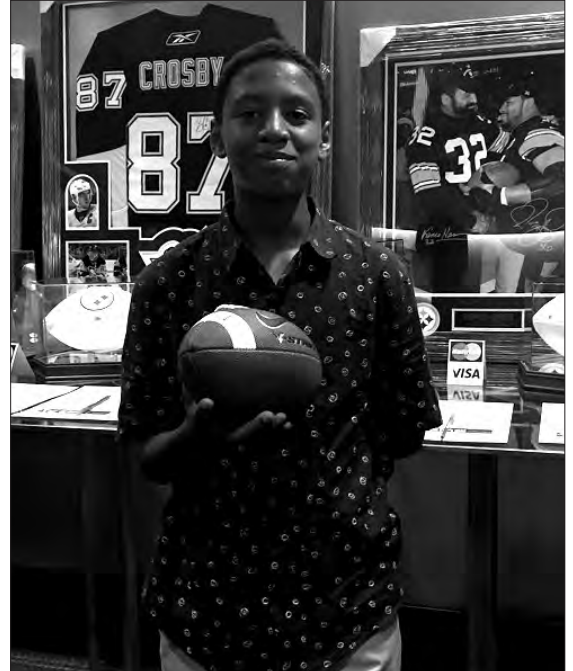

GARDEN UPDATE (written by Farmer Paul)

I've been busy this Summer keeping things happily growing in our school garden. At the start of the Summer, I was hired by Grow Pittsburgh as the full time Farmer at the Montessori school. So I am now splitting my duties between two schools, but my teaching capacity remains just as strong at Colfax.

All the crops at Colfax's garden did fantastic this season and with the exception of flea beetles attacking the kale/cabbage/collard seedlings, there were very few pests putting pressure on the food. I want to send a big word of appreciation to all the families who stepped up for Summer Garden Care. They spent a week managing weeding/watering/harvesting duties and making sure the garden had a strong human presence all Summer long, something the squirrels and rabbits surely noticed.

This school year we are changing the garden program up at Colfax. I will now offer 3rd grade regular garden lessons during the Winter, with a focus on garden and cooking science. I will continue to offer a robust program of regular garden lessons to K - 2. We will start the garden lessons this year with 2nd grade in the Fall. 1st grade will have garden lessons in the Spring. Kindergarten will have lessons at the end of the Fall and the Start of the Spring. It's a bit confusing but the way it will work, first graders will plant the garden in the Spring, second graders will harvest the garden in the Fall, and third graders cook up the harvest in the winter. Kindergarten will have sort of an introduction to the garden space, to get ready for more intensive lessons during the 1 - 3 grades.

The garden club that has been offered to 3rd - 5th graders in the Fall and Spring will no longer be running as it once did. The student demand to be involved completely outpaced our capacity to make it work in a meaningful, consistent way. Also, the sponsoring faculty member is not able to facilitate the club this year. With my additional teaching duties at Montessori and more grades served at Colfax, I won't be able to dedicate my work hours to the club. That said, if a parent is interested in making it happen and we can find a faculty member to facilitate, I am more than happy to help get the club up and running.

Our annual Chef in the Garden is tentatively scheduled for the first week in October. So far we have three chefs signed up to teach cooking lessons in the garden. COED FLAG FOOTBALL (written by Coach Woods)

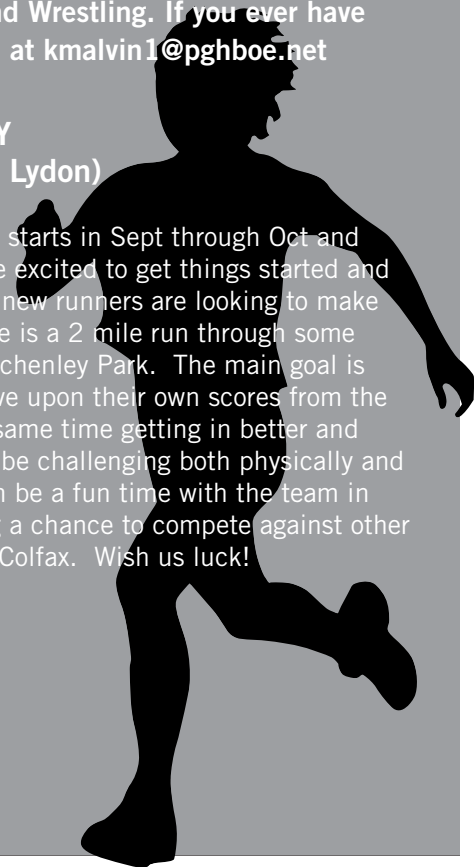

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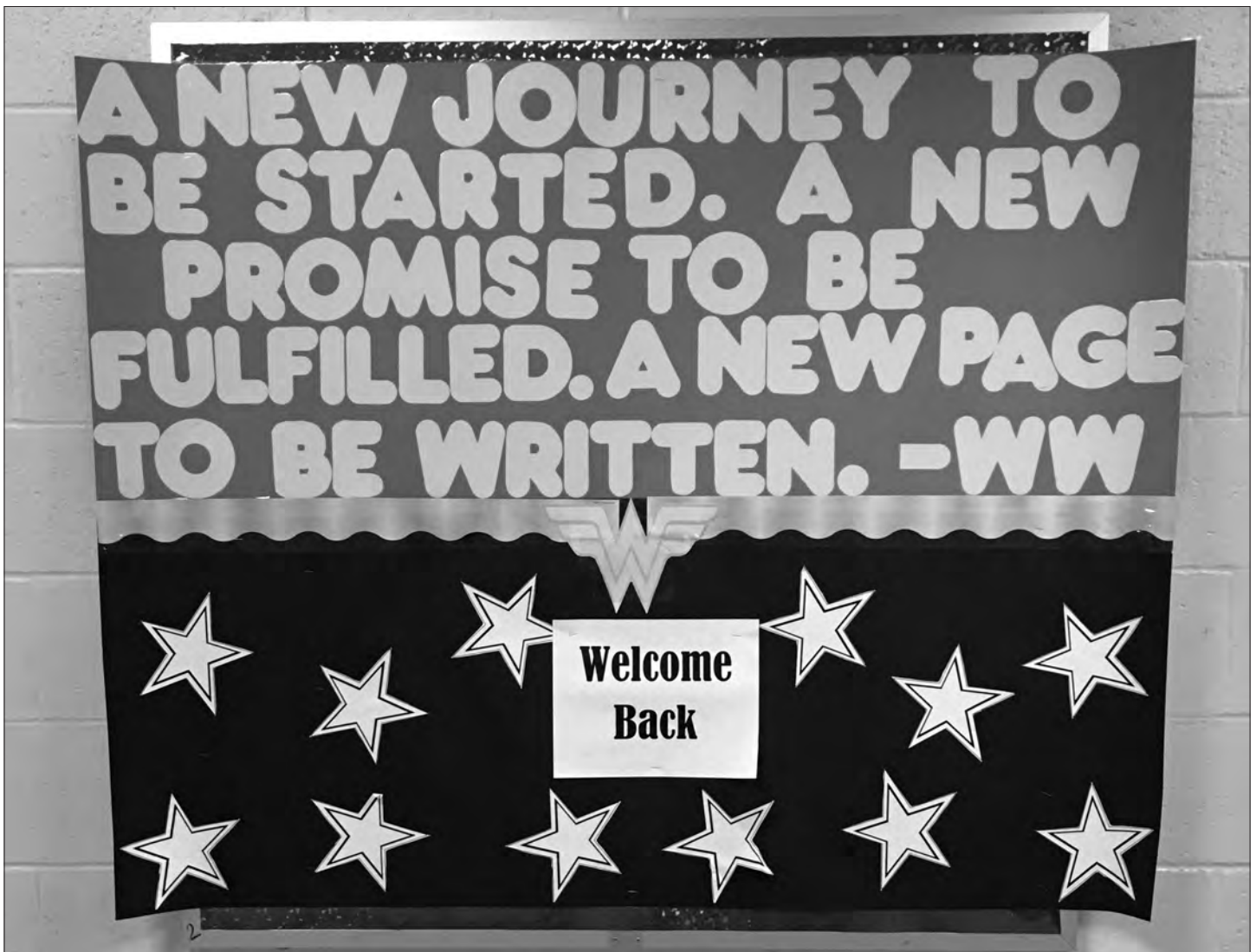
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
