# Summary of Community Feedback on Colfax K-8 Education 

Prepared by: 2019-2020 Colfax K-8 PTO Executive Board

The 2019-2020 Colfax Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) Executive Board solicited feedback from the Colfax community (families, teachers, and staff). In total, 127 members of the Colfax community submitted feedback between August 26 and September 4, 2019. The Colfax PTO's Executive Board's purpose for soliciting this feedback was to 1) provide members of the Colfax community a controlled forum to share their perspectives on their Colfax experience and 2) develop a written summary (this write-up) to help facilitate ongoing communications between Colfax families and the Pittsburgh Public Schools (PPS) Administration.

The feedback from the community was overwhelmingly positive.
Colfax has a distinguished reputation: Colfax is a neighborhood school with a diverse student population, well-rounded educational opportunities, and high-quality teachers. Colfax families love their Colfax teachers!

Colfax is a highly collaborative community: Families, teachers, and staff work together for our students.
That said, the majority of community member responses highlight concerns about overcrowding within Colfax.
Colfax is overcrowded: Families want to establish a reasonable number of students for the building.
The Colfax community is generally frustrated with the management of Colfax's increasing student population as it impacts student services, student well-being, and overall engagement of the Colfax community. Respondents to the feedback-request generally requested the following improvements:

Facilities: Reserve rooms for specialized instructional areas (science, art, music, physical education, etc.).
Provide more medical care space, especially to assist students in lower grades. Establish common space to accommodate Colfax's population: especially, more cafeteria space for students and space for students to play.

Processes: Establish longer productive lunch and recess time for students. Improve school access for families. Improve school administration and District responsiveness to family questions, concerns, feedback.

Staffing: Reduce student-to-teacher ratios and classroom sizes.

The PPS District has requested separate feedback as part of a District-wide initiative. Please take time to consider what makes Colfax great now and what is essential to make Colfax and all of PPS great going forward into the future.
