I encourage you to take moments to pause and disconnect from the busyness of the holidays. Give others especially your children the gift of time. This year, the PTO provided grants to teachers at the beginning of the year in the form of e-giftcards. Teachers were able to use the funds to support their classrooms in a multitude of ways. Teachers' feedback was overwhelmingly grateful as they were able to use the PTO grants for items such as:

- Flexible seating, chair bands, hippie sticks, manipulatives and fidgets for brain breaks and students who need more active movement
- Subject specific items such as maps, geometric tools, music supplies, fitness logs, reading intervention supplies and rewards
- Classroom supplies such as crayons, markers, pencils, colored pencils, books, book bins, sharpeners, paper, name tags, visual timers and lamination
- Speakers, microphones, wireless computer devices, toner
- Wipes, sanitizer, cleaning products
