DISCUSSION:

Membership Vote

On January 31, 2021 and February 7, 2021 the General Membership was informed of a planned vote on whether to approve a \$4300 expenditure for science kits to enhance virtual/hybrid learning, A vote was taken and the item was approved unanimously. The approved teacher grant request is included as part of these minutes.

Treasury report

The latest treasury report was reviewed and will be posted on the PTO website. Natalia announced that Colfax received \$4500 in corporate matching funds from some Ask Drive donations. Kuei-o and Natalia sent thank you letters to all those who donated \$250 or more.

Old Business

Ross identified for information that expenditures of \sim \$500 for PBIS Rewards Store were approved by the Board since the last meeting. This was done under the original approval for the PBIS software, which was authorized for \$1500 but came in closer to \$1000.

A big thanks went out to Jason Dancisin for the new and improved PTO website! It is now mobile friendly and looks great.

Ross has also posted an update to the Colfax Handbook.

Regarding the Amazing Books and Records fundraiser, Lisa recommended and others agreed to hold off on this until next year.

On the remaining Party 4 Play class basket/casino items, Lisa will contact Cindy Chepanoske and next steps will be discussed at the next meeting.

Upcoming Activities

The Colfax Communicator is being prepared by Jeanine.

Ross discussed the Colfax K-8 PTO Election for the 2021-2022 school year. Nominations and a voting for President will occur on April 21, 2021 and nominations and voting for Officers on May 12th. Ross noted that he has served as President for two years and his tenure will end per the PTO bylaws. Parents interested in serving and learning more about the responsibilities are welcome to contact Ross.

New Business

Community Book Drive. Stephanie will contact the parents who suggested this item and we will discuss further at a subsequent meeting.

Karey presented an item to consider for Black History Month which would use the \$1000 PTO budget line item for field trips to pay for family and/or teacher access to a Prime Stage Theater virtual play on Sojourner Truth. The play is targeted to Grades 5 and above and runs February 12-26. It is \$5 per family for access for a 24-hour period, or ~\$20 per teacher for use in a virtual model. They have the ability to provide an access code that could be shared with families and allow up to whatever number of families an organization wants to provide access.

There was general agreement that providing family access would be good. Ms. Zyhier Williams said that she could use Colfax social media to reach as many families as possible once plans are settled. Ms. Murphy asked to discuss this with the middle level and 5th grade teachers to gage interest and whether it could even fit it in with their already planned Black History Month activities. Ms. Murphy will follow up with Karey and Karey will take the lead to finalize the plan and work with Prime Stage Theater on access.

Brief Overview of Program

"Science in a Bag" (science kits) will be used to supplement the Colfax 3-8 science curriculum through an inquiry-based hands-on learning approach.

Justification. What is the problem? How does this help solve that problem?

Although Science kits are a consumable purchase, the Colfax staff believes that the knowledge and experience gained will have a lasting impact on student learning and engagement. Colfax science teachers want students to enjoy science as much as (or more than) their other classes, but student engagement and excitement in the sciences generally lags behind and especially so during remote learning. Once bags are completed for each grade level, they will be distributed for pickup at Colfax so that students have access to their own hands-on materials. If families are unable to pickup these materials, then Colfax staff will deliver directly to students so that all students have access to hands-on inquiry based lesson materials.

Goals & Objectives. Include tangible outcomes and measurable results

Increase and promote student engagement in science in both virtual and in-school learning settings.

Subject: General Membership request to approve new \$4300.00 expenditure for "science kits" to enhance virtual/hybrid learning.

Action: By 2/9/2021, complete review and submit comments on Grant Proposal Request (president@colfaxpto.org) to facilitate vote at our Colfax K-8 PTO's general membership meeting on 2/10/2021.

Description: The proposed science kits will be distributed to more than 500 of our students in Grades 3-8 (approximately \$9 per student) with the specific intent to enhance the virtual/hybrid learning experience. Our Colfax science teachers use these kits to enable their students to build circuits, test magnetism, create a basic motor, design and build the Rube Goldburg Machine, make bath bombs, create a recyclable roller coaster, create recyclable vehicles, and more. Once bags are completed for each grade level, they will be distributed for pickup at Colfax so that students have access to their own hands-on materials. Colfax staff will deliver kits to students whose families are unable to pick up these materials so that all Grades 3-8 students have access to hands-on inquiry based lesson materials. Quite a few of our usual expenditures (approved in our Colfax K-8 2020-21 Budget) will not be executed this year due to the impacts of the ongoing pandemic. In particular, this expenditure ultimately redirects funds previous budgeted to support our Grades 3+ students to this enrichment initiative.
